It's the Maniototo International Curling rink in Naseby that's creating a buzz this week, with New Zealand teams up against the best in the world and ready to take them on.

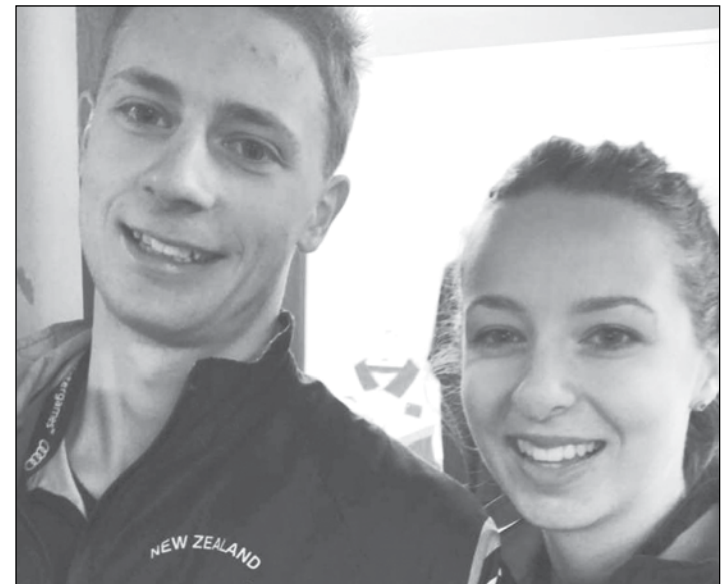
Brother and sister team Jessica and Ben Smith have enjoyed growing up in Naseby and are especially pleased to be representing their country in this year's winter games.

Cromwell College triumphs in debate tournament

It's official: Cromwell College has some of the region's top thinkers and talkers.

Its junior school debate team of Lucy Laws, Daniel Helms and Jemmimah McCombe-Rae defeated the favourites, unbeaten Mt Aspiring College in the final, negating 'That sports stars should be role models'.

The senior Cromwell team of year 11 students Myah Scott, Tabbitha McCombe-Rae and Bethany Johnstone defeated Dunstan High School 'B' in the first round, affirming 'That we need a change of government'.

They reached the semi-finals, losing to a strong and experienced Wakatipu High School but showed potential for future years.

Myah Scott was their outstanding speaker and received special commendation from Central Otago's rep selectors.

Levin, purchase a motor home, and start enjoying their new found freedom.

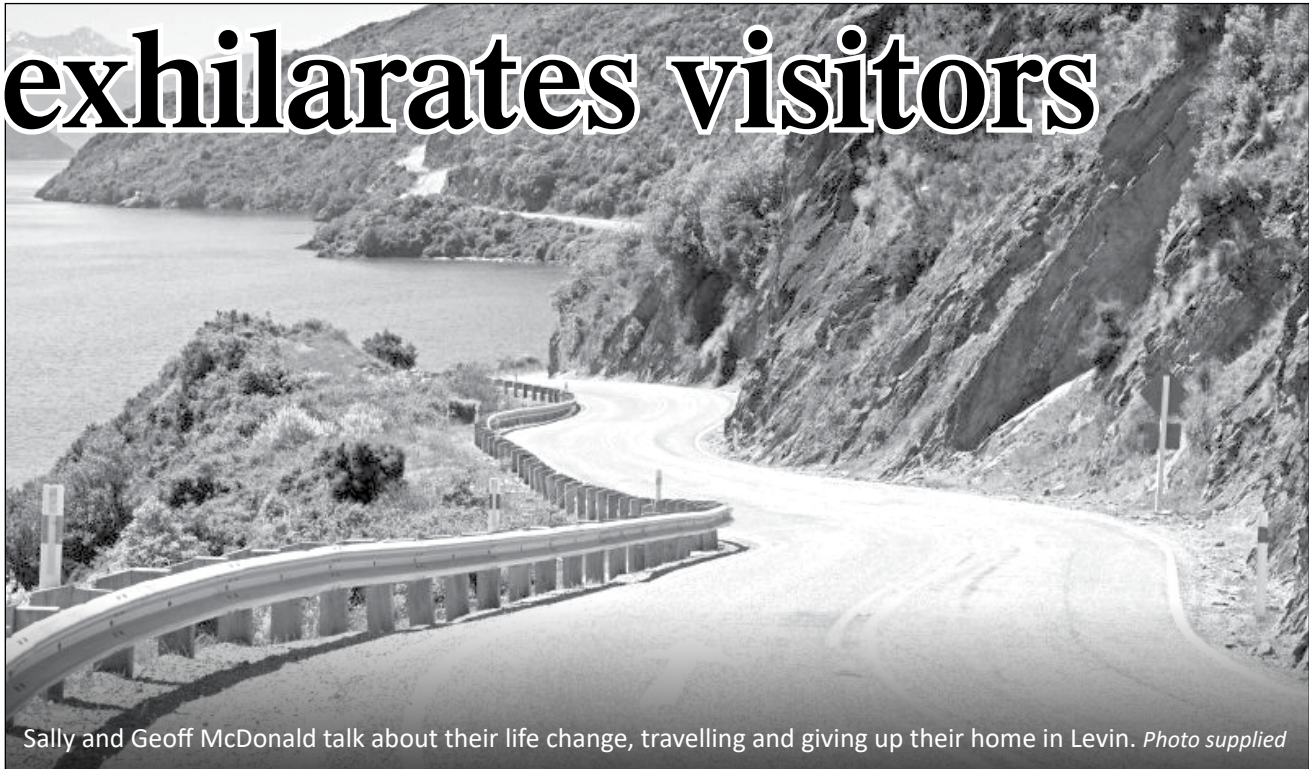
"It's sad to say, but we had never been to the South Island before deciding on a lifestyle change. It never entered our heads. It's hard to believe we are still in the same country.

Before the pair began travelling, Geoff was a mechanic, while Sally worked as a hairdresser.

"Now we enjoy a lot of time fishing, walking, driving and chatting away. There are times I miss home life, such as Christmas and birthdays, but we often time our trips to be in certain places at certain times of the year to catch up with family members," says Sally.

Geoff is enjoying not having the pressure of being at a job by 7am, and is adjusting to a nomadic lifestyle as well.

"Life on the road has taught me that when there's no one else to talk to, Sally can be fairly interesting. Just kidding. Sally is a great travel companion, and

"It's true what they say about the south. The further you go, the friendlier the people are. We always feel welcome in Central Otago, and it is one of the

It's been five years since the McDonalds packed up and left home. Although the decision was a scary one initially, they are more than happy with how things worked out and believe every day is an adventure.

School in a tough spot over bullying claims

Whenever the issue of school bullying arises, I remember back to my boarding school days of the 1970s and shudder.

The bullies had few restraints and only if we ended up in hospital was the school likely to intervene. Even then, a schoolboy code of silence made punishment almost impossible.

I can't say that things have got any worse – just that the claims are more public and take on different forms. Social media bullying is a modern plague and, ultimately, just as damaging as the blows that rained down on me some forty-odd years ago.

So it is that Cromwell College found itself in the spotlight last weekend – and an uncomfortable glare it was. The 'Otago Daily Times' reported claims by upset parents that the school had not been doing enough to confront incidents of bullying involving their students.

The school authorities found themselves between a rock and a hard place.

They could have defended themselves more vigorously but only by revealing the background of the children involved in the most unseemly incident - of a teenager assaulting a 10 year old child, and the video of that assault ending up on the internet.

Now, let's be plain. There can be no defence of an older child beating a younger child, but it's right that the Police are investigating because there is a back story. I'm aware of it – many Cromwell College students similarly.

Other allegations of Cromwell College not doing enough to confront the bullies in their midst – to be honest, you could make that claim against most schools in Otago and New Zealand. There are a bewildering array of legal rights that impede many schools from taking stronger action.

It's very frustrating for the parents of the bullied child, and my sympathies are with them. But it's soul destroying for the kid, and we all need to remember that.

But in a town like Cromwell – with only one secondary school and no other real schooling options – the Ministry of Education get very assertive about schools seeking to remove the problem children from their midst.

And there are problem kids. Most often from problem families. Cromwell is no different than any other New Zealand community, in that respect.

Cromwell College is holding a community meeting this month seeking community input on what kind of school they want the college to be. That's a perfect opportunity for your thoughts and responses on this very issue. The school is sincere – so have your say.
