By 10.30am baskets of food were laid in the earth and the cooking process began.

Karleigh Dimond and Mel Gerritson's skills and experience in the kitchen aided a team of volunteers keen to put on a dinner to remember.

The open day is a chance for locals to come down to the station, have a look around, check out the gear, ask questions and have a chat with not only the fire-fighters, but also the New Zealand Police and St John emergency services.

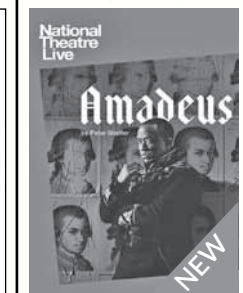

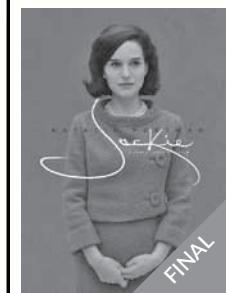

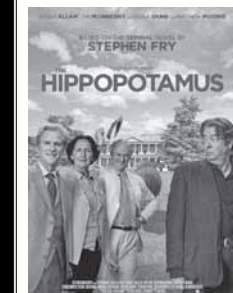

Little joy for Cromwell in regional council's latest plan

Sometimes you fight the good fight, and still lose.

It was an exercise in frustration last week when the Otago Regional Council had its meeting in Dunedin to finalise the 2017/18 Annual Plan.

The big issues around water, pest control and the lagarosiphon invasion of Lake Dunstan all had their debates, but most were unsatisfactorily settled.

With regards to rabbits and other Central pests, the regional council has been extraordinarily slack. Its pest strategy, established eight years ago, is hopelessly out of date and, clearly, not working.

Privately, councillors will concede the council has dropped the ball but that doesn't mean much to Central folk. The delay in the release of the Korean strain of the rabbit calicivirus has only amplified concerns.

Lake Dunstan is going to receive \$25,000 to combat our lake weed but almost everyone accepts that sum will go nowhere. The Guardians of Lake Dunstan have done a good job in highlighting this aquatic threat, but the Dunedin-based council still isn't listening.

I was in a minority of one trying to get the council to accept its proper environmental responsibilities. Lake Wanaka receives over \$400,000 to fight the weed – we get \$25,000. Just dreadful.

Wilding pines are another local issue and after being embarrassed by a government reprimand, the regional council has upped its funding considerably. Sometimes the solution – poisoning from the air – looks almost worse as the ghost trees around Roaring Meg testify.

Its another problem left to languish for too long. There are no pretty nor pleasant solutions – its eradicate now or be invaded.

That said, it will be good to have another Dunstan councillor around the regional council table. We've really missed the late Dr Maggie Lawton – she had the science and policy background to be making a difference.

And then there's water. The monster issue of the next decade for Central farmers, horticulturalists, fishers, hikers and locals. There is massive change coming that will significantly reduce water for irrigation.

It will also set, and fair enough, higher standards around water quality in rivers and streams. How this will all pan out? No-one really knows: and that's the genuinely scary part.

This alone was a highlight for the dapper young man.

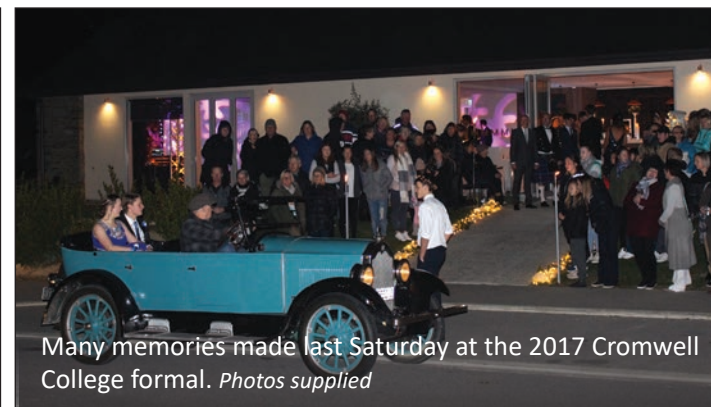
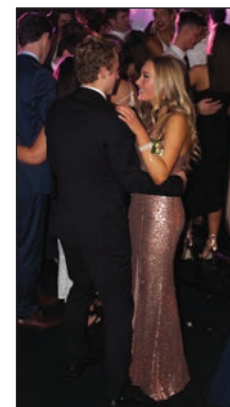
Long dresses adorned young ladies as the themed dance lived up to expectations.

Mike King explains the key to good mental health

Funny man and founder of the popular Nutters Club, Mike King arrived in Cromwell last Tuesday evening to talk to families about mental health and the impact these issues have on communities.

A group of around 150 people turned out to hear Mike's message.

Mike has been an advocate for young people and their mental health, with his message aiming to extinguish the stigma associated with mental health in communities.

Young people today are dealing with feelings of depression, sadness and anxiety and while Mike talked frankly

about the issues affecting young people, he was able to connect with teenagers in the audience and provide good suggestions for parents and those professionals who work with young people on a daily basis.

Mike believes self-esteem is a key factor in ensuring good mental health among young people and having a loving and supportive relationship with trusted adults is hugely important.

With a lack of time challenging most busy families, it is simply a priority to take time and use it wisely.

Mike's "Key to Life" seminar is literally a lifesaver for many young

people, and having the value of adults who care is hugely beneficial for those struggling with feelings of being bad, worried, or simply done in.

Often these feeling do turn to self harm, withdrawal, or even suicide. The inner critic can be fierce.

Mike's visit to Cromwell gave the audience an opportunity to learn and understand more about the issues surrounding mental health, our young people and our community, while recognising the contributions those in professions who deal with young people make on a daily basis.

Outstanding concert pianist to perform this Saturday

Concert pianist Jian Liu began his music career in his home city of Qingdao, on the east coast of China

By the time he was nine Jian’s progress was such that he moved the 800 kilometres from Qingdao to Beijing to further his piano studies at the Central Conservatory of Music spending six years there.

Having achieved success in a music competition in Missouri, he moved to America when he was sixteen and gained his Bachelor of Music in Piano and Bachelor of Science in Business from Arizona State University before completing both Master of Music and Master of Musical Arts degrees at the Yale School of Music.

Jian then worked at the Yale School

before he joined the piano faculty at the New Zealand School of Music in Wellington where he is currently the Programme Leader of Classical Performance and Head of Piano Studies.

In Jian’s first year in New Zealand he played a 10 concert tour, which included Cromwell, under the auspices of Chamber Music New Zealand.

Peter Mead, of Cromwell Community Arts who are presenting Jian again in association with Chamber Music New Zealand, recalls his performance well. “I think everyone in the audience that night was stunned. Jian gave an absolutely outstanding performance.”

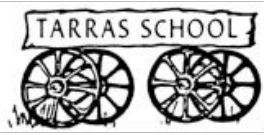

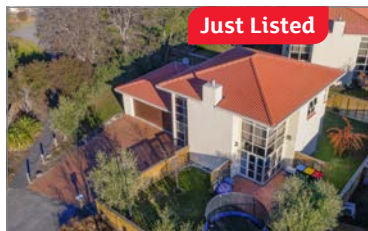
