Over 800 natives planted by Mokihi Trust

In a little over a year, volunteers and members from Mokihi Trust have planted over 800 native plants at Richards Beach. The aim is to revegetate the region and create a reference area they can use for education and to present a sustainable ecosystem.

Last Sunday, 12 local volunteers turned out to help with planting over 70 native plants such as kowhai, native broom, tussocks and hebes. “It has been hard work clearing lupin plants and briar, however, the area at Richards Beach is taking shape,” says trust secretary Barbara Armstrong. With a love of the bush, Barbara is enjoying being part of Mokihi Trust and along with four other trustees is working hard to ensure future generations will have access to environmentally native areas. The trust is based on a similar and very successful group from Wanaka called Te Kakano.

The Te Kakano group have been very supportive, helping Mokihi Trust get started by initiating a scoping study in 2015 to judge interest in creating a similar group in the Cromwell area. The Mokihi Trust was formed in 2016. “We have great support from our members and volunteers, and always have people ready to help with our planting days which take place from March through to October. “We are particularly interested in looking after our river banks and waterways, and have great support from our sponsors. “Without the support from sponsors and volunteers, we would be unable to do what we do,” comments Barbara. The next planting is planned for 11am on Sunday August 13th at Richards Beach. Grab a spade and join in the movement to restore and establish pockets of indigenous biodiversity in the Cromwell area.

Due to increasing concerns regarding results of the Government’s economic policies and no real long-term awareness of consequences, I am again standing as candidate for Democratic Social Credit for the Waitaki electorate in the upcoming election. Some of you may ask “who are Democrats for Social Credit?” (DSC). DSC is the third largest registered party in New Zealand and has had members in Parliament. We stand for policies that matter to all of us and mainly hinge on the need for major monetary reforms. You may think this is all above you, and does not affect you directly, well I can tell you that it absolutely does matter. There is pressure on education and health, there has been changes to our own after hours medical provisions, water changes both rural and local, roading and infrastructure funding issues along with rents going beyond equitable reach. This is just to name a few. The house price issue is not just a market-led, uncontrollable invisible force, but is part of an economic ideology based on “trickle down” which has now been proven flawed. The slack monetary policy and control of the banking sector lavishing debt on our country has burdened the economy with \$230 billion of alarming mortgage debt. All other parties are proposing policies that re-arrange the life boats. For example, proposing the solution of 10c a litre fuel tax to fund Auckland fast rail is another cost on economy. Our (DSC) leading policy is to use Reserve Bank credit at nil interest non-loans to fund directly into projects. This policy eliminates the need for overseas bank loans currently costing \$10 million a day. The advantage is that this change will allow greater funding for us in the regions such as local body. No more bank borrowing, with having more resources locally. This method of funding reform was used during the 1930’s to fund the first state housing programme. This is not fringe or pie in the sky economics, this model has proven results with 35 economists worldwide writing to the UK Government proposing similar solutions. To help Cromwellians move away from using plastic bags, a free, funky alternative is being offered by a group of local volunteers. Helpers are needed to make the fabric bags, which will be placed around town for people to use and return, or keep. “We all know it’s time to move away from single-use plastic but changing habits isn’t always easy. We just wanted to do something to make it easy and appealing to help people along,” group member George Affleck said. Pupils from Goldfields Primary School were also helping the group, who are now asking for donations of fabric, ribbon, webbing and cotton. Any style, weight and colour of fabric was welcome and could be dropped off to the Cromwell i-site. Sewers were needed to help make bags and there would be other jobs such as cutting out patterns. The first working bee had been scheduled for Thursday, August 24 in the Hynds building on Traders Lane off McNulty Road. Sewers could bring their own machine along and a friendly welcome was guaranteed, George said. This would run from 6pm to 8pm and a daytime session would be held from 10

until 2pm on Monday, August 28 with the venue yet to be confirmed. Lots of different sizes and styles of bag would be made and templates were also available if people wanted to do their sewing at home. The idea was inspired by the Boomerang Bag movement which began in Australia in 2013. The Cromwell community is getting behind the idea of becoming more aware of recycling and refusing rubbish. Students from Goldfields Primary School’s Horizon class have been leading the way in looking for new and better ways of keeping Cromwell cleaner and better to live in and visit.

Along with students, locals have also realised there is a need to start finding ways of recycling and creating better habits going forward to start eliminating the amount of rubbish left behind.

A small group of volunteers headed out on Sunday to clear rubbish along

Bannockburn Road. Surprisingly, they returned home after only two hours with 120kgs of rubbish stuffed into 16 large rubbish bags.

The majority of volunteers were younger people who are aware of the effects rubbish is having on our surrounding environments.

“With the community’s support, pupils from the Horizon class are seeing that change is possible and in fact happening. We live in a beautiful location and looking after our environment is important.

As a community, there are things we can do and looking outside the square for solutions is a great way to get people discussing what can be done,” says Horizon class teacher Charlotte Rawcliffe.

Extra teachers, 3D printers, kayaks, microscopes, musical instruments and sports and kapahaka uniforms are among the resources funded for Cromwell College through donations from a group of Cromwell businesses.

Scholarships, Technology and Sport

There had been direct benefit from academic scholarships for merit and excellence endorsements in NCEA and prizes for end of year honours.

A popular initiative had been the Sport and Culture Fund to help students travelling beyond Cromwell for their representative activity.

These included about 40 students starting their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Hillary Award, tournament teams, rowing team and individuals in sport, drama, Outward Bound or Spirit of Adventure travel, he said.

“We are now exceptionally well resourced for a school of our size with excellent computing and IT resources as

well - fibre, computers on wheels, four pods of computers and full compliments of classroom computers.

The funding to support extra staffing for a Gifted and Talented Teacher and Learning Support Coordinator had been beneficial, as well as the running of pilot classes in senior music and now Year 9 drama.

The wide range of businesses included accountants, retailers, real estate, earth movers, hospitality businesses and the Rotary Club of Cromwell. About one third had been part of the programme since it began eight years ago, Board of Trustees chairman, Greg Wilkinson said.

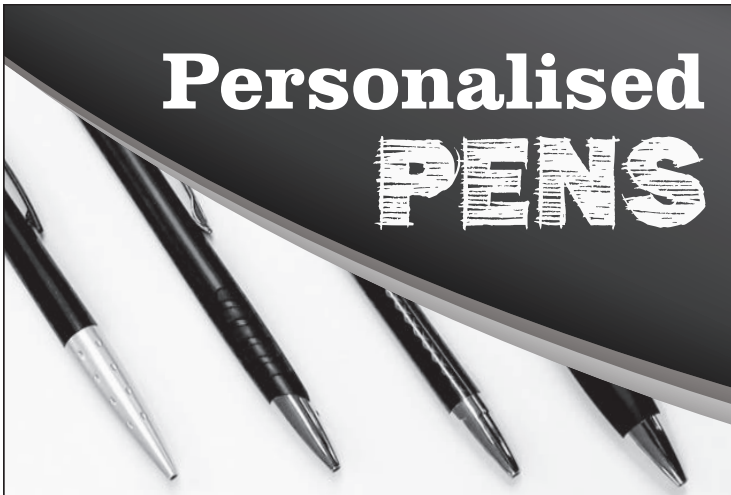
